Did You Know?

- ☞ Most trees do not have a tap root, but instead have a spreading pancake root system, the majority of which is within 18" of the soil surface.
- ☞ On large, mature trees with room to grow, the roots may grow out at least twice as far as the tree crown.
- ☞ Lawn roots are extremely competitive with tree roots for moisture and nutrients in the upper 4" of soil. Removing lawn and adding an organic mulch or a ground cover will give tree roots an advantage.

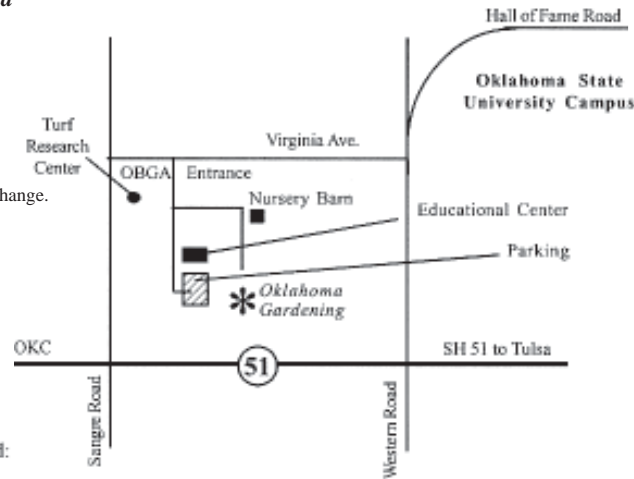
